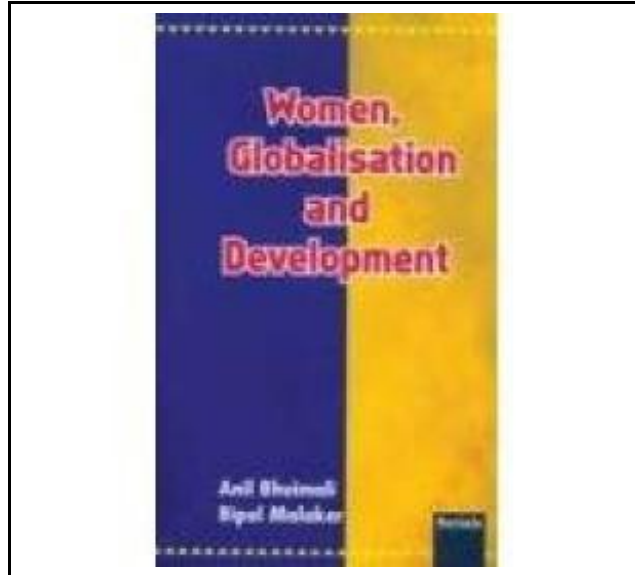

Due to globalisation and for a variety of reasons developed countries are not able to concentrate in some areas of production. It has thus treated a gap in Demand Supply situations and the gap has ultimately been filled in by the developing countries. The share of developing countries in total World output has increased remarkably from 17.9 per cent in 1988 to 41.2 per cent in 1995 and again to 40.4 per cent (excluding the share of Israel) in 2000. The shares of whole Asia during the same periods of time were 7.2, 29.4 and 25 per cents respectively. Remarkable development has also occurred in the growth rate. The growth rates of the developing countries both in terms of GDP and per capita GDP have been greater than that of the developed countries. It is true that growth rates in the developing countries were much Higher in 1990s than in 1980s. Growth rates have rising trends in almost all the developing countries of Asia even today.
