This vessel took its wheels on deck and during the greater part of the trip made use of sails only, so that it can hardly be numbered among ocean steamers. By the time that the Sirius and the Great Western made their memorable race across the Atlantic this early timidity of steam navigation had disappeared and the greatest expectations were set on the future of trans-Atlantic shipping, although the most daring dreamer failed to imagine what has actually been accomplished in the sixty years that have since elapsed.
